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Notice concerning the Impact of the Typhoon (10th, named “Haishen”) in Kyushu Region

We would like to express our deepest condolences to all those affected by the typhoon “Haishen” in Kyushu region on September 6 and 7, 2020 and our wishes for the earliest possible recovery.

Canadian Solar Infrastructure Fund, Inc. (“CSIF”) announces that it has conducted a review of its power generation facilities in connection with the typhoon in the region.

According to Canadian Solar O&M Japan K.K. which is the O&M operator for the CSIF, due to electricity power failure in Kyushu Electric Power’s area, CS Isa-shi Power Plant, CS Yusui-cho Power Plant, CS Isa-shi Dai-san Power Plant, CS Hiji-machi Power Plant and CS Ashikita-machi Power Plant in that area had been stopping generating electricity. The power generation in CS Hiji-machi Power Plant and CS Ashikita-machi Power Plant have already been recovered in order and the remaining 3 PV Power plants will be recovered shortly after visiting them in sequence. Additionally, the CSIF’s PV power plants in the region suffered no material damages affecting their energy output from the typhoon as far as is known as at 12:00pm of September 7, 2020.

CSIF will continue to monitor and review its portfolio, and additional disclosure will be made should there be any material developments.
