The ANA Group Announces Interim Flight Schedule for Fiscal Year 2021

TOKYO January 26, 2021

ALL NIPPON AIRWAYS CO., LTD which is a wholly owned subsidiary company of ANA HOLDINGS INC. has revealed its interim flight schedule for Fiscal Year 2021.



ANA Group Announces Interim Flight Schedule for Fiscal Year 2021

- For domestic and international routes, ANA will maintain a flexible approach to its flight operations, and provide flight schedule updates on a monthly basis. ANA will continue to monitor demand trends and travel viability amid immigration restrictions and other measures related to COVID-19 as it assesses flight schedules on a continuous basis.
- Flights will mainly be operated using smaller aircraft to temporarily downsize operations and reduce costs. With the early retirement of Boeing 777 aircrafts, a greater number of long-haul flights will be operated with the Boeing 787 aircraft to raise operational efficiency.
- For FY2021, domestic route operations will make up the core of earnings, and the network will be reorganized to serve routes with higher demand.

TOKYO, **Jan. 26**, **2021** – All Nippon Airways (ANA), Japan's largest 5-Star airline for eight consecutive years, announced its interim flight schedule plan for Fiscal Year 2021. Over the next year, ANA will continue to provide updated flight schedules on a monthly basis as it maintains flexible flight operations amid the ongoing impact of COVID-19.

The key points for FY2021 are as follows:

Domestic Routes

- Due to the continued impact of COVID-19, ANA will continue to review and announce any changes or suspensions to its flight schedule on a monthly basis. When an increase in demand is expected, the company will respond appropriately by increasing flight frequency or serving the routes with larger aircraft.
- ANA will retire its large aircraft ahead of schedule, and temporarily utilize aircrafts for international routes for domestic flights. Furthermore, operations will be maintained with small and medium-sized aircraft to reduce the impact on the environment and lower costs. Compared to FY2020, the usage rate of large aircraft will be reduced by 50 percent, while the usage rate of small aircraft will increase by 30 percent.
- In planning operations, ANA will raise profitability by monitoring demand trends and the status of the market more frequently. We will also suspend or reduce flights in response to demand while increasing the frequency for certain routes when there is an increase in demand at peak seasons.
- Our domestic operations will make up the core of ANA's earnings, and the company will aggressively
 reorganize its route network to maximize revenues. During the summer, when demand for travel is
 expected to increase, flights to Okinawa, Hokkaido, and flights for the Haneda=Miyako route will be
 increased.

International Routes

- Due to the continued impact of COVID-19 as well as related immigration restrictions and quarantine measures, ANA will continue to review and adjust its flight schedule and increase or reduce the frequency of flights accordingly.
- In keeping with the previously announced plan*11 to retire half of ANA's Boeing 777 aircraft, a greater number of long-haul flights will be operated with the Boeing 787 aircraft, which will help reduce environmental impact as well as cut operating costs.
- In order to provide customers with more information and to allow for earlier travel preparations, the suspension or reduction of select routes have already been determined. However, we will continue to monitor demand trends and resume or increase flights on a monthly basis.
