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1. Qualitative Information on Consolidated Results, Etc. for the First Three Months of the Fiscal Year Ending March 2022

(1) Details of consolidated results

In the first three months under review (from April 1, 2021 to June 30, 2021), the global economy was improving significantly from the situation in the previous year, which was affected by COVID-19, particularly in developed countries thanks to large-scale economic measures and progress in vaccination.

In the U.S., economic activity is recovering rapidly, supported by progress in vaccinations in addition to large-scale economic measures, and driving the global economy. However, there are concerns about the reemergence of infection by new virus strains, rising inflation, and the scaling back of quantitative easing policies, which could hinder stable growth. In Europe, despite two consecutive quarters of negative growth in the previous year due to the rapid spread of new strains, economic activity is in a recovery phase due to progress in vaccinations, particularly in the U.K. In China, exports related to the novel coronavirus are declining with the restoration of supply chains in major countries, and the special demand factor for early infection control is shrinking and returning to normal levels.

In emerging countries, in contrast to major developed countries that are exhibiting a strong economic performance, inflationary pressures due to rising global commodity prices and damage to supply chains due to the spread of COVID-19 are spreading as the economic environment remains severe due to delays in vaccinations. As a result, the global economy is increasingly showing a trend towards a K-shaped recovery, depending on progress in vaccinations.

Japan lags behind other developed countries in terms of vaccinations, and its economic recovery has been slower than that of other major economies, with repeated declarations of a state of emergency and the resulting reduction in consumer activity.

In this environment, the results of the Group for the first three months under review are as shown below.

Revenue increased in almost all businesses centered on the meat products business and the feedstuff business, which were supported by rallying market conditions, and the mobile business, where store footfall was recovering, and the energy business, where the trading volume of crude oils and petroleum products increased due to rising crude oil prices. While profit decreased in the aerospace business where contracts with government agencies were between seasons, profit increased in the meat products business, where revenue increased, the semiconductor parts and manufacturing equipment business, which enjoyed strong semiconductor demand, and the steel tubing business, which was backed by recovering energy demand.

Consolidated revenue increased \(\frac{4}{3}\)3,196 million (23.3%) year on year, to \(\frac{4}{175}\),567 million. Consolidated gross profit also increased \(\frac{4}{3}\),337 million (15.6%) from a year earlier, to \(\frac{4}{2}\)4,782 million. Consolidated operating profit rose \(\frac{4}{1}\),661 million (49.0%) from a year earlier, to \(\frac{4}{5}\),047 million, reflecting an increase in gross profit, despite a rise in selling, general and administrative expenses. Largely due to the rise in operating profit, profit before tax increased \(\frac{4}{1}\),866 million (54.6%) year on year, to \(\frac{4}{5}\),284 million, and profit attributable to owners of the parent rose \(\frac{4}{8}\)94 million (37.9%) year on year, to \(\frac{4}{3}\),253 million.

Results for each business segment are described below

(i) Electronics & Devices

Revenue increased \$10,019 million year on year, to \$53,757 million, attributable to higher revenue in the mobile business and the semiconductor parts and manufacturing equipment business. Operating profit rose \$298 million, to \$2,192 million, due to higher profit in the semiconductor parts and manufacturing equipment business, and profit attributable to owners of the parent increased \$191 million, to \$1,144 million.

(ii) Foods, Meat & Grain

Revenue increased \$8,141 million year on year, to \$70,074 million, reflecting a rise in revenue in the meat products business and the feedstuff business. Operating profit rose \$1,175 million, to \$1,536 million, due to higher profit in the meat products business and the food business, and profit attributable to owners of the parent increased \$616 million, to \$1,057 million.

(iii) Steel, Materials & Plant

Revenue increased \(\frac{\pmathbf{\frac{4}}}{1,479}\) million year on year, to \(\frac{\pmathbf{\frac{4}}}{31,937}\) million, due to higher revenue in the energy business and the steel tubing business. Operating profit rose \(\frac{\pmathbf{\frac{4}}}{517}\) million, to \(\frac{\pmathbf{\frac{4}}}{56}\) million, on stronger profit in the steel tubing business, and profit attributable to owners of the parent increased \(\frac{\pmathbf{4}}{165}\) million to \(\frac{\pmathbf{4}}{434}\) million.

(iv) Motor Vehicles & Aerospace

Revenue increased \(\frac{\pmathbf{4}}{3},201\) million year on year, to \(\frac{\pmathbf{1}}{16},835\) million, thanks to higher revenue in the motor vehicles and parts business. Operating profit decreased \(\frac{\pmathbf{4}}{3}15\) million, to \(\frac{\pmathbf{4}}{5}86\) million, due to a fall in profit in the aerospace business, and profit attributable to owners of the parent declined \(\frac{\pmathbf{2}}{2}19\) million, to \(\frac{\pmathbf{4}}{3}49\) million.

(v) Other

Revenue increased \(\frac{4}{357}\) million year on year, to \(\frac{4}{2}\),962 million. Operating profit fell \(\frac{4}{30}\) million, to \(\frac{4}{168}\) million, and profit attributable to owners of the parent decreased \(\frac{4}{124}\) million, to \(\frac{4}{96}\) million.

(2) Details of financial position

(i) Assets, liabilities and equity

Total assets at the end of the first quarter of the fiscal year under review declined \(\frac{\pma}{27}\),309 million from the end of the previous fiscal year, to \(\frac{\pma}{250}\),186 million.

Interest-bearing debt increased \(\frac{45,261}{261}\) million from the end of the previous fiscal year, to \(\frac{4127,418}{127,418}\) million, mainly due to a rise in short-term borrowings. Net interest-bearing debt after deducting cash and deposits rose \(\frac{47,301}{301}\) million from the end of the previous fiscal year, to \(\frac{447,821}{427,821}\) million. Interest-bearing debt does not include lease liabilities. In terms of equity, equity attributable to owners of the parent decreased \(\frac{485}{485}\) million from the end of the previous fiscal year, to \(\frac{4143,841}{43,841}\) million, mainly reflecting cash dividends paid and a fall in other components of equity associated with falling share prices at the end of the period, despite an increase in profit attributable to owners of the parent.

As a result, the ratio of equity attributable to owners of the parent came to 26.1%. The net debt-equity ratio ("net DER") was 0.3 times.

(ii) Cash flows

Cash and cash equivalents at the end of the first quarter under review fell \(\frac{\pma}{2}\),065 million from the end of the previous fiscal year, to \(\frac{\pma}{7}\)8,980 million.

The state of cash flows and factors for each category for the first three months of the fiscal year under review are as follows:

(Cash flows from operating activities)

Net cash provided by operating activities in the first three months under review stood at \(\frac{\pmathbf{\pmathbf{x}}}{2,556}\) million (versus net cash provided of \(\frac{\pmathbf{\pmathbf{x}}}{7,808}\) million in the first three months of the previous fiscal year), primarily reflecting the accumulation of operating revenue.

(Cash flows from investing activities)

Net cash used in investing activities in the first three months under review stood at ¥4,230 million (versus net cash used of ¥1,815 million in the first three months of the previous fiscal year), due to business investments, including acquisitions of subsidiaries and businesses.

(Cash flows from financing activities)

Net cash used in financing activities in the first three months under review came to ¥498 million (versus net cash used of ¥9,979 million in the first three months of the previous fiscal year), mainly due to cash dividends paid and the repayment of lease liabilities, despite cash inflows resulting from an increase in short-term borrowings.

Causes of year-on-year increase/decrease **0.3** billion yen up [Electronics & Devices] The semiconductor parts and manufacturing equipment business remained strong on growth in shipments of manufacturing equipment and consumables related to semiconductors and LCD panels following strong demand. The ICT solutions business remained firm, mainly due to an increase in projects related to security and network. In the mobile business, operating profit increased slightly, mainly due to the impact of the declaration of a state of emergency, although store footfall was returning. 1.2 billion ven up [Foods, Meat & Grain] In the meat products business, operating profit increased after the struggle in food service-related sales in the previous year, aided by rising prices of livestock products in general, in addition to a recovery in demand. The food business remained strong on growth in transactions of products for the retail market. The grain and feedstuff business remained firm under rising prices of grain and feedstuff. **0.5** billion ven up [Steel, Materials & Plant] The machine tools and industrial machinery business remained firm, recovering from the business environment in the same period of the previous fiscal year where the business had been strongly affected by COVID-19. The steel tubing business was on track to recovery following the bottoming of energy demand. However, in the energy business, operating profit temporarily declined, although a recovery is expected in the future deliveries. **0.3** billion yen down [Motor Vehicles & Aerospace] The aerospace business remained sluggish as contracts with government agencies were between seasons. In the motor vehicles and parts business, however, transactions of motor parts remained strong given the recovery of production at clients.
