FY2021 Capital Expenditure and Total Investment Plan

Sumitomo Metal Mining Co., Ltd. (SMM) plans to undertake a total of 78.1billion yen on capital expenditures, on a consolidated basis during the 2021 fiscal year (April 1, 2021 — March 31, 2022). The total investment represents a 123% increase from that of FY2020. A breakdown by business segment is as shown below.

We are continuing to move forward with careful review of the Pomalaa project, which had implementation scheduled in the 2018 3-Year Business Plan, obtaining the necessary permits and consulting with partners while closely watching the spread of COVID-19.

We will make separate disclosures when investment decisions have been made.

The following large-scale capital expenditures are scheduled on a consolidated basis in FY2021:

- 1. Cote Gold Project: 20.4 Billion yen (total outlay: US \$ 536 million)
- 2. Expansion of production capacity for cathode materials for secondary batteries for electric vehicles: 0.5 billion yen (total outlay: 47billion yen)
- 3. Expansion and improvement of Battery Research Laboratories: 1.4 billion yen (total outlay: 1.6 billion yen)
- 4. Besshi-Niihama District Div. newly established company dormitory: 1.0 billion yen (total outlay: 4.7 billion yen)
- 5. Development of ore body confirmed in 2012 at Hishikari Mine: 0.4 billion yen (total outlay: 3.7 billion yen)
- 6. Switching to LNG boilers *: 0.2 billion yen (total outlay: 0.8 billion yen)
