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1. Overview of Operating Results for the Fiscal Year Ended March 31, 2023

(1) Operating Results

In the fiscal year ended March 31, 2023 (fiscal 2022), the external environment surrounding the Sanwa Group remained unstable primarily due to soaring raw material prices, an increase in policy interest rates around the world aimed at curbing accelerating inflation, rising energy prices caused by the prolonged conflict in Ukraine, and sharp fluctuations in exchange rates. On the other hand, business activity continued to return to normal in many countries and the economy saw a modest upturn in line with recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic.

Amid this environment, from fiscal 2022, the Sanwa Group launched its long-term management vision, Sanwa Global Vision 2030, and the Mid-Term Management Plan 2024, and worked to establish the foundation to become a global leader of smart entrance solutions that meet the changing needs of society due to climate change and digitalization.

To expand and strengthen core businesses in Japan, North America, and Europe, we enhanced our core businesses and service business by promoting measures to pass on the rising costs of raw materials to our prices, while strengthening the foundation in preparation for future business growth. In January 2023, we acquired U.S.based Door Control, Inc. and Door Concepts, Inc., which specialize in the sale, installation and repair of automatic doors. To strengthen the basis for growth in the Asian business, we increased production capacity at Sanwa Novoferm Changshu for our door business in China and worked to generate synergies with AUB Limited, which manufactures and markets industrial doors mainly for Hong Kong and Macau, and which we acquired in August 2022. To expand products for disaster prevention and climate change response and enhance smart products and services, we released high-performance insulated overhead door from the Re-Carbo series, a product that significantly improves thermal insulation performance while also enhancing convenience and saving space, the IoTcompatible MADOMORE Change SY system for motorizing existing manual window shutters, and smartphone operation system RemoSma for garage doors. To increase productivity through digitalization and manufacturing innovation, we introduced an enterprise resource planning (ERP) system and strengthening its operation in various regions and launched a field service management system as part of our investment promoting digitalization. In addition, in Japan, we established a new sound insulation test building, and in Europe, we expanded the production capacity of our dock leveler plant and invested in production equipment automation. To enhance sustainability management, we set key performance indicators (KPIs) tied to material issues in environmental, social and governance (ESG) sectors and sought to expand our products that mitigate climate change, while reducing CO2 emissions and water consumption to help realize a sustainable society.

As a result of the above, net sales for the fiscal year ended March 31, 2023 increased by 25.4% year on year to ¥588,159 million. On the profit side, operating profit increased by 58.7% year on year to ¥56,307 million, ordinary profit increased by 54.7% to ¥52,780 million, and profit attributable to owners of parent increased by 44.8% to ¥33,084 million.

The following describes performance by segment.

(1) Japan

Net sales amounted to ¥252,877 million, a 7.0% year-on-year increase, with segment income of ¥25,023 million, a 1.5% increase. This was primarily due to strong performance in the core products of shutters and doors and in the maintenance and service business as well as to efforts aimed at passing on increased costs in steel and various materials and parts to our prices.

(2) North America

Net sales amounted to ¥218,968 million, a 57.4% year-on-year increase (a 31.5% increase on a foreign currency basis), with segment income of ¥29,049 million, a 246.7% increase, mainly due to an increase in volumes as supply chain issues eased and broad success in passing on the increase in raw material costs to our prices.

(3) Europe

Net sales amounted to ¥105,394 million, a 22.9% year-on-year increase (a 15.6% increase on a foreign currency basis), with segment income amounting to ¥4,268 million, an 8.5% increase. This was primarily due to efforts to pass on rising raw material and energy costs to our prices and increased volumes despite a challenging environment for orders owing to deterioration in market conditions.

(4) Asia

Net sales amounted to ¥10,855 million, a 41.9% year-on-year increase, with segment income amounting to ¥258 million, a 115.7% increase, mainly due to continued solid performance in Hong Kong and Taiwan despite the lockdowns in Shanghai.

(2) Financial Position

As of March 31, 2023, total assets increased by ¥56,037 million from the end of the previous fiscal year, to ¥442,274 million, primarily due to increases in trade receivable and inventories. Liabilities increased by ¥16,998 million from the end of the previous fiscal year, to ¥199,923 million, mainly due to increases in trade payable and lease obligations. Net assets increased by ¥39,038 million from the end of the previous fiscal year, to ¥242,350 million, primarily due to increases in retained earnings and foreign currency translation adjustment.

As a result, the shareholders' equity ratio rose by 2.2 points from the end of the previous fiscal year to 54.4%.

(3) Cash Flows

As of March 31, 2023, cash and cash equivalents increased by ¥9,755 million from the end of the previous fiscal year, to ¥71,153 million. Cash flows by category during the fiscal year under review are as follows.

Cash flows from operating activities

Net cash provided by operating activities amounted to ¥34,425 million (net cash of ¥20,526 million was provided in the previous fiscal year), mainly due to the recording of profit before income taxes.

Cash flows from investing activities

Net cash used in investing activities came to ¥15,941 million (net cash of ¥21,353 million was used in the previous fiscal year), mainly attributable to payments for acquisitions of non-current assets.

Cash flows from financing activities

Net cash used in financing activities totaled ¥9,887 million (net cash of ¥27,363 million was used in the previous fiscal year), mainly due to payment of cash dividends.

(4) Forecast and Plans for the Future

The global economy is on a recovery track as the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic subside and supply chain disruptions ease. However, outlooks are expected to remain uncertain due to global inflation, rising energy prices, financial instability caused by policy interest rate hikes and foreign exchange fluctuations around the world, and heightened geopolitical risks.

Amid this environment, the Sanwa Group will continue to implement the following basic strategies with a focus on establishing the foundation to become a global leader of smart entrance solutions as it enters the second year of the Mid-Term Management Plan 2024 toward the goals of the Sanwa Global Vision 2030.

Basic Strategies

- 1. Expand and strengthen core businesses (shutters, doors & service) in Japan, North America, and Europe
- 2. Strengthen a basis for growth of the Asian business
- 3. Expand products for disaster prevention and climate change response and enhance smart products and services
- 4. Increase productivity through digitalization and manufacturing innovation
- 5. Enhance sustainability management

In consideration of the above, the forecast for consolidated financial results in the next fiscal year is as follows.

(5) Basic Profit Appropriation Policy and Dividends for Fiscal 2022 and Fiscal 2023

To further promote management aimed at increasing corporate value while also improving the corporate structure and strengthening the management foundation, the Company aims to maintain a stable dividend payout ratio under its basic policy to distribute profits based on consolidated performance, specifically targeting a payout ratio of 40% of profit attributable to owners of parent.

For the current fiscal year, the Company plans to pay a year-end dividend of ¥33.0 (annual dividend of ¥58.0), an increase of ¥8.0 from the most recently annuanced dividend, taking into consideration the business results for the fiscal year ended March 31, 2023 and future business development.

For the next fiscal year, the Company plans to pay an annual dividend of ¥58.0 (¥29.0 paid at the end of the second quarter and ¥29.0 at the end of the fiscal year), the same amount as the current fiscal year.

Retained earnings will be utilized for strategic investments such as M&A, as well as capital expenditures and reduction of interest-bearing debt.

2. Basic Concept of Selecting Accounting Standards

The Sanwa Group applies Japanese GAAP in its accounting. Going forward, the Group will closely monitor future trends as they pertain to the application of International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS).

(Changes in Accounting Policies)

(Application of the Implementation Guidance on Accounting Standard for Fair Value Measurement)

The Company has applied the Implementation Guidance on Accounting Standard for Fair Value Measurement (ASBJ Guidance No. 31, June 17, 2021; hereinafter referred to as the "Implementation Guidance") from the beginning of the fiscal year ended March 31, 2023. The Company will apply the new accounting policies specified in the Guidance prospectively in accordance with the transitional treatment set forth in paragraph 27-2 of the Implementation Guidance. The application of these standards does not affect the consolidated financial statements.

(Application of ASU 2016-02, "Leases (Topic 842)")

Overseas subsidiaries subject to application of the accounting principles generally accepted in the United States (U.S. GAAP) have applied the Accounting Standards Update (ASU) 2016-02, "Leases (Topic 842)," effective from the fiscal year ended March 31, 2023. As a result, lessees are to recognize all leases as assets and liabilities on their consolidated balance sheets, in principle. As an accepted transitional measure for when applying this accounting standard, the Group adopted a method of recognizing the cumulative effects of the application of accounting standard on the date of its initial application.

As a result of the application of this accounting standard, right-of-use assets under non-current assets in the consolidated balance sheets at the end of the fiscal year increased by ¥6,465 million, lease obligations under current liabilities increased by ¥1,743 million, and lease obligations under non-current liabilities increased by ¥4,922 million.

(Segment Information, etc.)

1. Outline of reportable segments

Reportable segments of the Group are components for which discrete financial information is available and which are subject to regular discussion by the Board of Directors of the Company, the highest management decision-making body, to make decisions on the allocation of management resources and assess performance.

The Group is primarily engaged in the manufacture and sales of construction materials for commercial and residential buildings, as well as the maintenance and service business for these products. The Group mainly comprises Sanwa Shutter Corporation in Japan, Overhead Door Corporation in North America, Novoferm GmbH in Europe, and Shanghai Baosteel-Sanwa Door Co., Ltd., SANWA SHUTTER (HK) Ltd., AnHo Metal Industrial Co., Ltd., Vina-Sanwa Company Liability Ltd., and SUZUKI SHUTTER (HK) Ltd. in Asia. Local legal entities are independent management units, and formulate overall regional management strategies for their products and conduct separate business activities.

Accordingly, the Group is comprised of regional segments and divided into legal entities, based on the manufacture and sales systems. The Group's four reportable segments are "Japan," "North America," "Europe," and "Asia."

The major products and services of each reportable segment are as follows:

Japan

Rolling shutters, shutter-related products, door products for buildings, partitions, stainless steel products, store front products, window products, residential door products, exterior products, residential garage door products, automatic door products, and the maintenance and service business, etc.

North America

Rolling shutters, shutter-related products, industrial sectional door products, residential garage door products, operator for garage doors and other doors, automatic door products, and the maintenance and service business, etc.

Europe

Rolling shutters, shutter-related products, door products, industrial sectional door products, residential garage door products, operator for garage doors and other doors, and the maintenance and service business, etc.

Asia

Rolling shutters, shutter-related products, door products, residential garage door products, and the maintenance and service business, etc.

2. Inter-segment transactions are inter-company transactions and are based on market price and other relevant factors. 3.
