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Supplementary Information for the Year Ended March 31, 2023

1. Operating Results

(1) Overview of Operating Results

In the fiscal year ended March 31, 2023, although the Japanese economy is exhibiting some signs of weakness, it has been gradually recovering. With regard to the outlook, it is necessary to pay close attention to the risk that a downturn in overseas economic conditions will depress the Japanese economy, the impact of rising prices and fluctuations in financial and capital markets amid continuing global monetary tightening.

In the food industry, with the easing of restrictions due to COVID-19, demand for home-cooked meals has begun to settle, but demand for dining out has been showing signs of recovery, partly due to an increase in inbound demand.

On the other hand, although the sharp rise in global raw material and energy prices due to the situation in Ukraine and other factors appears to have passed its peak, the price increase of various products, including food products, continues to affect the purchasing behavior of consumers.

Amidst this business environment, the MEGMILK SNOW BRAND Group pursued initiatives to "Establish earnings bases in four business sectors (Dairy Products; Beverages and Desserts; Nutrition; and Foodstuffs and Seed)" in accordance with the Group Medium-term Management Plan 2022. In the fiscal year ended March 31, 2023, the Group undertook: (1) strategic expansion and further product mix improvement of yogurt, cheese, and other mainstay products, centered on functionality; (2) simultaneous pursuit of scale expansion and profit generation through continuation of marketing investment in the nutrition business field; (3) strategic expansion and development of an earnings base in the foodstuffs and seed business area; and (4) bolstering of the Group's overall strengths by making full use of the Group's management resources and improving value chain productivity.

However, in the fiscal year ended March 31, 2023, although net sales were higher than the previous year, we were unable to absorb all of the cost increases despite price revisions and capacity changes due to soaring raw material and energy prices caused by currency fluctuations and the situation in Ukraine.

As a result, in the fiscal year ended March 31, 2023, consolidated net sales were ¥584,308 million (up 4.6% YoY), operating profit was ¥13,054 million (down 27.7% YoY), ordinary profit was ¥14,480 million (down 27.6% YoY), and profit attributable to owners of parent was ¥9,129 million (down 24.3% YoY).

Although not applicable to changes in specified subsidiaries, Belle Neige Direct Co., Ltd. has been included in the scope of consolidation due to its increased importance over the three months ended June 30, 2022.

Additionally, during the three months ended June 30, 2022, The National Federation of Agricultural Cooperative Associations converted preferred shares into common shares, thereby decreasing MEGMILK SNOW BRAND Co., Ltd.'s shareholding ratio of Kyodo Milk Industry Co., Ltd., making Kyodo Milk Industry Co., Ltd. no longer an affiliate of MEGMILK SNOW BRAND Co., Ltd. As a result, Kyodo Milk Industry Co., Ltd. has been removed from the scope of entities accounted for using the equity method. As of March 31, 2023, there were 33 subsidiaries and 13 affiliates.

Operating results by business segment for the fiscal year ended March 31, 2023, were as follows. Net sales by segment are sales to outside customers.

1) Dairy Products

This segment comprises the manufacture and sale of dairy products (cheese, butter, powdered milk), margarine, nutrition business products (functional foods and infant formula), and other products. Net sales were ¥252,070 million (up 6.4% YoY), and operating profit was ¥9,720 million (down 22.4%).

(Net sales)

Sales of butter increased year on year due to improved production systems, mainly at the Isobunnai Plant and Ami Plant, and an increase in sales for household use. Sales of commercial-use butter increased year on year due to a recovery in demand for dining out and hotels.

In cheese, sales of processed cheese and natural cheese both increased year on year, with brisk sales of Sakeru Cheese.

Sales of functional food products continued to grow, owing to continued strong sales in the subscription-based e-commerce business, proactive marketing investment, and increasing health-awareness among consumers.

(Operating profit)

Operating profit decreased due to factors including increased raw material costs, higher operating expenses, despite price revisions and capacity changes.

2) Beverage & Dessert

This segment comprises the manufacture and sale of drinking milk, fruit juice beverages, yogurt, dessert, and other products. Net sales were ¥241,113 million (up 0.6% YoY) and operating profit was ¥1,629 million (down 54.9% YoY).

(Net sales)

With regards to sales of beverages (both milk-based and other beverages), sales of MBP Drink, a food with functional claims, Mainichi Honebuto MBP® and Yukijirushi Coffee were strong, but sales in this segment overall declined year on year.

In yogurt sales, sales of family-use products, such as plain yogurt increased year on year, but sales were lower than the previous year despite an increase in the market due to the slower growth of the yogurt market.

Desserts performed well thanks to efforts to strengthen product appeal, including the launch of new products, and the expansion of existing products.

(Operating profit)

Operating profit decreased due to factors including increased raw material costs and higher operating expenses despite price revisions.

3) Feed and Seeds

This segment comprises the manufacture and sale of cattle feed, pasture forage/crop and vegetable seeds, landscaping, and other products. Net sales were ¥53,474 million (up 14.1% YoY), and operating profit was ¥219 million (down 68.4%).

(Net sales)

Overall segment sales increased year on year, due to factors including the rise in compound feed sales prices.

(Operating profit)

Operating profit decreased due to an increase in raw material costs.

4) Other

This segment comprises joint distribution center services, real estate rental, and other businesses. Net sales were ¥37,649 million (up 8.0% YoY), and operating profit was ¥1,476 million (up 28.5%).

(3) Future Outlook

With regard to the outlook for the Japanese economy in the future, the situation in Ukraine and other factors remain uncertain, and it is expected that the high price of raw materials and energy will continue to remain to some extent, although they have passed their peaks.

In the food industry, demand for home-cooked meals has remained stable, and demand for dining out is expected to recover as a result of downgrading the legal status of COVID-19 to Class 5 under the Infectious Diseases Act and the impact of inbound tourism. On the other hand, the market is expected to change as consumer sentiment declines due to rising prices of various products, and as the selection of products becomes stricter when purchasing. In addition, the dairy industry continues to face the challenge of disposing of excess inventory of powdered skim milk due to the easing of demand and supply, but raw milk production is expected to decline for the second consecutive year, and the Group assumes that demand and supply are in an uncertain situation that may fluctuate between easing and tightening depending on dairy consumption trends.

The Group has been working on the MEGMILK SNOW BRAND Group Long-term Vision 2026 (FY2017 to FY2026), but due to significant changes in the external environment, the company has decided to review the Long-Term Vision 2026 and newly formulated the MEGMILK SNOW BRAND Group Mid-term Management Plan 2025 (hereinafter "Mid-Term 2025").

In FY2023, the first year of the Plan, the Group will work on the three pillars of the business strategy based on the 2025 Medium-Term Plan: "Creating new seeds for growth," "Expanding volume by utilizing our production bases" and "Strengthening and supporting domestic dairy production bases."

As a result of the foregoing, the Group forecasts consolidated net sales of ¥616,000 million (up 5.4% YoY), operating profit of ¥14,000 million (up 7.2% YoY), ordinary profit of ¥15,000 million (up 3.6% YoY) and profit attributable to owners of parent of ¥9,500 million (up 4.1% YoY) for the fiscal year ending March 31, 2024.

By segment, full-year sales forecast is ¥264,500 million for Dairy Products (up 4.9% YoY), ¥256,000 million for Beverages & Desserts (up 6.2% YoY), ¥55,500 million for Foodstuffs and Seed (up 3.8% YoY), and ¥40,000 million for Other (up 6.2% YoY).

(4) Basic Policy on Profit Distribution and Cash Dividends for the Fiscal Year Ended March 31, 2023 and the Fiscal Year Ending March 31, 2024

The Company's basic profit distribution policy is to maintain financial soundness through profit generation, improve capital efficiency through investments in cash-generating infrastructure and growth, and enhance returns to shareholders.

With regard to dividends, taking into comprehensive consideration the Group's consolidated business results and financial condition, the Group has endeavored to maintain a stable dividend, and based on the fact that the equity ratio was more than 50% in the fiscal year ended March 31, 2022, the Group has enhanced shareholder returns and raised the target consolidated dividend payout ratio to a level of more than 30%.

Under this dividend policy, the Company has decided to pay a dividend of ¥60 per share for the fiscal year under review. The payment of dividends from surplus will commence on June 8, 2023.

In addition, based on the above basic policy, the Group plans to pay a dividend of ¥60 per share in the next fiscal year.

2. Basic Policy on the Selection of Accounting Standards

The Group's policy is to prepare consolidated financial statements in accordance with Japanese accounting standards for the time being, taking into consideration comparability of consolidated financial statements over time and comparability between companies.

With regard to application of International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS), the Group's policy is to respond appropriately, taking into account circumstances in Japan and abroad.

(Notes on the Assumption of a Going Concern) Not applicable.

(Additional Information)

Due to the fire that occurred on June 30, 2022 at the Ami Distribution Center of SBS Flec Co., Ltd., an equity-method affiliate, in the fiscal year ended March 31, 2023, the Company recorded a loss of ¥2,239 million on its inventory as fire loss under extraordinary loss, and also recorded ¥2,242 million yen in compensation received for the said loss as compensation income under extraordinary income.

For the nine months ended December 31, 2022, the amount of loss on non-current assets incurred by SBS Flec Co. Ltd. was included in equity in losses of affiliates. However, in the fourth quarter of the fiscal year ending March 31, 2023, insurance income was received by SBS Flec as a result of the receipt of insurance proceeds for the insured non-current assets that were damaged. As a result, the impact of the series of events related to the fire on our consolidated financial statements was immaterial.

In addition to the above, there are other areas where negotiations are still ongoing, and depending on the situation, may have an impact on the consolidated financial statements for the next fiscal year.

(Change in presentation)

(Consolidated statements of income)

In the fiscal year ended March 31, 2022, "Contribution" and "Special milk formula supply business expenses", which were separately presented in "Non-operating expenses", are included in "Other" under "Non-operating expenses" in the fiscal year ended March 31, 2023 because their amounts have become immaterial. To reflect these changes in presentation, the consolidated statements of income for the fiscal year ended March 31,2022 have been reclassified.

As a result, "Contribution" of ¥141 million yen, "Special milk supply business expenses" of ¥120 million, and "Other" of ¥409 million, which were included in "Non-operating expenses" in the consolidated statements of income for the fiscal year ended March 31, 2022, have been reclassified as "Other" of ¥ 671 million.

(Consolidated statements of cash flows)

"Loss (gain) on sales of investment securities", which was included in "Other" under "Cash flow from operating activities" in the fiscal year ended March 31, 2022, is separately presented under "Cash flows from operating activities" in the fiscal year ended March 31, 2023, due to its increased materiality. To reflect this change in presentation, the consolidated financial statements for the fiscal year ended March 31, 2022 have been reclassified.

As a result, "Other" of ¥828 million presented under "Cash flows from operating activities" in the consolidated statements of cash flows for the fiscal year ended March 31, 2022, has been reclassified as "Loss (gain) on sales of investment securities" of minus ¥2 million and "Other" of ¥830 million.

(Segment Information)

1. Overview of reportable segments

The Company's reportable segments are components of the MEGMILK SNOW BRAND Group about which separate financial information is available. These segments are subject to periodic examinations to enable the Company's board of directors to decide how to allocate resources and assess performance.

The Group is engaged mainly in manufacturing and selling of products made from milk, etc., manufacturing and selling of cattle feed, pasture forage and crop seed, and other related products. Dairy products such as cheese and butter, and beverages and desserts such as milk and yogurt are mainly handled by the Company, while feedstuffs and seed are mainly handled by Snow Brand Seed Co., Ltd.

The Group's operations are therefore classified based on products into three reportable segments, namely, dairy products business, beverage and dessert business, and feedstuffs and seed business.

Calculation method for net sales, profit/loss, assets, liabilities and other amounts by reportable segment

Accounting methods applied in the reportable segments are in compliance with accounting policies applied for the preparation of consolidated financial statements.

Segment profit represents operating profit.

Intersegment sales and transfers are based on market price.
