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1. Overview of Business Results, etc.

(1) Overview of Business Results for the Fiscal Year

During this consolidated fiscal year, the global economy continued to be difficult due to sluggish global investment demand, particularly in the manufacturing sector. In China, demand remained generally sluggish due to uncertain economic conditions, and in Japan and Asia, with the exceptions of some areas, demand remained weak but showed a gradual recovery trend toward the end of the period. In Europe and the U.S., on the other hand, geopolitical risks and other economic slowdowns led to a deceleration starting in the second half of the fiscal year.

In this economic environment, the MISUMI Group is leveraging its unique Business MODEL, which encompasses manufacturing and distribution businesses. By advancing the global business foundation supporting these operations, we contribute to industries related to automation demand, particularly the manufacturing industry, by meeting customers' needs for reliable and quick delivery. To further strengthen the solid business foundation and global network in IT, production, and logistics that we have built up over the years, we have completed the implementation of core system renewal in Japan, our largest base. At the same time, while we continued to accelerate new business policies, including the development of new products and services, both sales and profits declined from the previous year due to the impact of weak global demand for capital investment.

This resulted in consolidated net sales of ¥367,649 million (1.5% decrease year-over-year). In terms of profit, as affected by decreased sales volume and increased costs related to the introduction of a new core IT system for Business MODEL innovation, etc., operating income was ¥38,365 million (17.7% decrease year-over-year), and ordinary income was ¥41,265 million (13.7% decrease year-over-year). Net income attributable to owners of parent was ¥28,152 million (17.9% decrease year-over-year).

1) Factory Automation (FA) Business

In the FA business, sales in Japan managed to maintain the same level as the previous year, but overseas sales, particularly in China, were sluggish, resulting in sales of 118,219 million yen (3.0% decrease year-over-year) and operating income of 15,097 million yen (29.4% decrease year-over-year).

2) Die Components Business

The Die Components business, while generally weak in all regions, captured automotive-related demand, particularly in Asia and Europe, which, supported by exchange rate effects, contributed to the increase in both in sales and profit. Sales was ¥79,932 million (1.0% increase year-over-year) and operating income was ¥9,139 million (4.8% increase year-over-year).

3) VONA Business

VONA business is MISUMI Group's sales and distribution business of manufacturing / automation-related equipment parts and MRO (Maintenance, Repair, and Operations) products. In addition, this business segment includes MISUMI branded products and third-party manufacturers' products. Sales in Japan were nearly flat year-over-year, but in overseas, particularly China and Asia, remained sluggish due to the slowdown in customer factory operations. Sales was \\$169,497 million (1.5% decrease year-over-year), and operating income was \\$14,128 million (14.4% decrease year-over-year).

(2) Overview of Financial Position for the Fiscal Year

Assets, liabilities and net assets

1) Assets

Total assets as of the end of the fiscal year were \(\frac{\pm}{4}13,517\) million, an increase of \(\frac{\pm}{3}3,058\) million (9.3%) compared to the previous year-end. Current assets were \(\frac{\pm}{3}13,381\) million, an increase of \(\frac{\pm}{3}3,758\) million (10.9%). This was mainly attributable to cash and deposits, which rose by \(\frac{\pm}{2}29,289\) million (24.5%), and an increase of \(\frac{\pm}{1},518\) million (2.4%) in merchandise and finished goods. Non-current assets were \(\frac{\pm}{1}00,136\) million, an increase of \(\frac{\pm}{4}3,00\) million (4.5%). Property, plant and equipment amounted to \(\frac{\pm}{5}1,042\) million, an increase of \(\frac{\pm}{2},636\) million (5.4%). This was mainly attributable to an increase of \(\frac{\pm}{3}3,472\) million (68.9%) in construction in progress. Intangible assets increased by \(\frac{\pm}{1}1,087\) million (3.1%) to \(\frac{\pm}{3}36,109\) million. Investments and other assets increased by \(\frac{\pm}{5}76\) million (4.6%) to \(\frac{\pm}{1}2,984\) million.

2) Liabilities

Total liabilities amounted to \$65,837 million, an increase of \$1,603 million (2.5%) compared to the previous year-end. Current liabilities were \$49,929 million, an increase of \$987 million (2.0%). This was mainly attributable to income taxes payable, which rose by \$1,514 million (35.4%). Long-term liabilities amounted to \$15,908 million, an increase of \$616 million (4.0%). This was mainly attributable to liability for retirement benefits, which increased by \$411 million (5.9%).

As a result, the current ratio was 6.3 times, and the Company maintained high stability.

3) Net assets

Total net assets amounted to \(\frac{\pmathbf{4}}{3}47,679\) million, an increase of \(\frac{\pmathbf{4}}{3}3,455\) million (10.6%) compared to the previous year-end. This was primarily because shareholders' equity increased by \(\frac{\pmathbf{4}}{2}12,235\) million (4.3%) due to an increase in retained earnings and treasury stock, and an increase of \(\frac{\pmathbf{2}}{2}0,993\) million (76.1%) in accumulated other comprehensive income including foreign currency translation adjustments.

As a result, the equity ratio was 83.3%, compared to 82.3% at the end of the previous year.

(3) Overview of Cash Flows for the Fiscal Year

At the end of the fiscal year, cash and cash equivalents amounted to \\ \pm 133,376 \text{ million, an increase of \\ \pm 26,736 \text{ million compared to the previous year-end.}

Cash outflows from investing activities amounted to a net cash outflow of ¥18,995 million, (a net cash outflow of ¥19,033 million for the same period in the previous year). The breakdown is as follows. The purchase of fixed assets was ¥17,976 million. Payments into time deposits were ¥18,392 million. Refund from time deposits was ¥16,909 million.

Cash outflows from financing activities amounted to a net cash outflow of \$18,968 million, (a net cash outflow of \$11,169 million for the same period in the previous year). The main items were purchase of treasury stock of \$10,095 million and dividends paid of \$7,058 million.

(4) Future Outlook

We expect the global economy, including Japan, to face an uncertain business environment as the global supply chain continues to shift toward regional blocs. In the industrial sector, however, there are high expectations that the demand for automation will continue to grow worldwide as various social issues are addressed. To meet these customer needs, we will continue to advance our IT, logistics, and manufacturing business foundations and further refine our "globally reliable, quick delivery". We will accelerate the development of regional markets, new businesses, new products and services, etc. to improve customer's time value, and promote the transition to the Digital MODEL that fits each market to respond to the different needs of each market.

Regarding the consolidated earnings forecast for the fiscal year ending March 31, 2025, the MISUMI Group expects net sales of \(\frac{\pma}{3}\)393,000 million, operating income of \(\frac{\pma}{4}\)46,000 million, and net income attributable to owners of parent of \(\frac{\pma}{3}\)3,400 million.

The Group consists of MISUMI Group Inc. (the Company), 51 consolidated subsidiaries, 1 non-consolidated subsidiary and 2 affiliated companies, operating in three business segments: FA Business, Die Components Business and VONA Business.

"FA Business" develops and provides standard components that help streamline production and save labor costs in a production system such as factory automation as well as auto locating modules for high-precision production equipment. Various optics research and experimental equipment and components for production equipment, which change due to the digitalization of electronic devices, are also developed and offered.

"Die Components Business" serves the automotive, electronics, and electrical machinery industries by developing and supplying standardized die components for metal press and plastic injection molding applications and precision die components.

"VONA Business" provides third-party brands alongside original MISUMI-branded products mainly through online sales. It provides indirect materials such as MRO (consumables), etc. as well as manufacturing, automation-related equipment parts.

We are pleased to inform you that at the meeting of the Board of Directors held on April 26, 2024, in accordance with the provisions of Article 156 of the Companies Act, applied pursuant to Article 165, Paragraph 3 of the same Act, the following resolutions were adopted on matters relating to the acquisition of treasury stocks.

1. Reasons for the repurchase of treasury stocks

The Group is committed to the Growth Chain-reaction management based on the employees' challenges to contribute to the sustainable growth of the IA (Industrial Automation) industry, which is our customer, and to support the sustainable development of society through automation and labor saving in the IA industry. To achieve this, we are actively investing in growth in regions, businesses, and the development of new products and services, and are working to advance our Business MODEL that contributes to increasing customer's time value. In addition, to increase corporate value over the medium to long term, we will accurately assess the cost of capital and aim for a return on capital that exceeds the cost of capital, or, to widen the equity spread. To that end, we will strike a balance between investments in growth from a medium- to long-term perspective and the return of profits to our shareholders.

We will revise the target payout ratio from 25% to 30%, considering the management foundation expansion, strengthening of the financial position, and capital efficiency improvement. Stock repurchases will be implemented flexibly depending on the situation, such as cash position, investment opportunities for growth, and stock market trends.

The purpose of this stock repurchase is to enhance shareholder returns and to facilitate a flexible capital policy.
