[Qualitative Information, Financial Statements]

1. Qualitative information regarding the status of consolidated business results

During the first quarter of the fiscal year ending March 31, 2016 (the three-month period from April 1, 2015 to June 30, 2015), the global economy continued to gradually improve, although the outlook going forward grew less clear, reflecting concerns over the impact of monetary policy in the United States, the reignition of the debt crisis in Greece, and turmoil in the Chinese stock market. The U.S. economy continued to improve, backed by improvement in employment and steady domestic demand. European economies showed signs of improvement as well, led by Germany and the U.K. The pace of economic growth in China, meanwhile, showed signs of further slowdown. Japan's economy saw gradual recovery, as corporate earnings improved and personal consumption showed signs of pickup.

With regard to the business conditions surrounding the SCREEN Group, in the semiconductor industry, capital investment among memory manufacturers was firm, backed by demand for smartphones. In addition, reflecting growing demand for IoT-related electronic devices the market for equipment for wafers 200mm or under showed signs of demand expansion. With regard to graphic arts equipment, demand in the Japanese market continued to recover. In the FPD business field, investment in large-sized television LCD panels continued in China.

Under these circumstances, the SCREEN Group posted consolidated net sales of \$56,116 million for the first quarter of the fiscal year ending March 31, 2016, an increase of \$3,641 million from the corresponding period of the previous fiscal year. On the earnings front, operating income totaled \$3,299 million, up \$1,059 million year on year, reflecting improvement in the variable cost ratio and the increase in net sales, despite the increase in fixed costs due to rises in personnel costs and R&D expenses as well as the depreciation of the yen. Ordinary income amounted to \$3,433 million, up \$1,078 million year on year. Quarterly profit attributable to owners of parent totaled \$2,266 million, up \$730 million compared with the corresponding period of the previous fiscal year.

Performance by reportable segment is explained below.

The Semiconductor Solutions (SE) Segment

The Graphic and Precision Solutions (GP) Segment

In the GP segment, due to efforts to further penetrate the print on demand (POD) equipment market as well as the depreciation of the yen, sales of graphic arts equipment increased year on year. Sales of printed circuit board (PCB)-related equipment were also up, reflecting a rise in sales of mainstay direct imaging systems. As a result, net sales in this segment came to \forall 14,774 million, up 21.2% year on year. This segment posted operating income of \forall 987 million, expanding 121.4%, from the corresponding period of the previous fiscal year, reflecting the increase in net sales, despite the rise in fixed costs due mainly to the depreciation of the yen.

The Finetech Solutions (FT) Segment

In the FT segment, although domestic sales decreased, sales of production equipment for large-sized television LCD panels in China increased year on year. As a result, net sales in this segment amounted to ¥6,308 million, up 26.6% year on year. On the earnings front, reflecting the increase in net sales, this segment posted operating income of ¥173 million, compared with an operating loss of ¥414 million in the corresponding period of the previous fiscal year.

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2. Qualitative information regarding changes in consolidated financial position

Total assets as of June 30, 2015 stood at \(\frac{\pmath{x}}{276,707}\) million, an increase of \(\frac{\pmath{x}}{27,190}\) million, or 10.9%, compared with March 31, 2015. This was largely due to increases in cash and time deposits, notes and accounts receivable-trade, and inventories.

Total liabilities amounted to \$160,839 million, up \$22,835 million, or 16.5%, compared with the end of the previous fiscal year. This was mainly attributable to the increase of short-term loans payable to compensate for temporarily negative operating cash flows, causing interest-bearing debt to increase, as well as an increase in notes and accounts payable-trade. Interest-bearing debt increased by \$16,909 million, or 42.6%, from March 31, 2015 to \$56,586 million. Net interest-bearing debt, or interest-bearing debt minus cash and time deposits, increased by \$9,827 million, compared with the previous fiscal year-end, to \$23,864 million.

Total net assets amounted to \$115,868 million, up \$4,354 million, or 3.9%, from March 31, 2015. This was mainly attributable to the recording of quarterly profit attributable to owners of parent, an increase in valuation difference on available-for-sale securities due to a rise in the market values of held stocks, as well as an increase in foreign currency translation adjustment due to the depreciation of the yen, despite the payment of cash dividends.

As a result, the equity ratio as of June 30, 2015 stood at 41.6%.

Status of Cash Flows

The status of cash flows for the first quarter of the fiscal year ending March 31, 2016 is as follows.

Net cash used in operating activities amounted to \(\pm 7.588\) million, compared with \(\pm 1.360\) million used in operating activities in the first quarter of the previous fiscal year. This was because the increase in notes and accounts receivable-trade, increase in inventories, and other outflows surpassed such cash inflows as income before income taxes and an increase in notes and accounts payable-trade.

Net cash used in investing activities amounted to \$1,558 million, compared with \$1,668 million used in investing activities in the first quarter of the previous fiscal year. This was attributable to the purchase of property, plant and equipment, such as equipment for R&D.

Net cash provided by financing activities amounted to ¥15,225 million, compared with ¥1,158 million used in financing activities in the first quarter of the previous fiscal year. This was due in part to a net increase in short-term loans payable and cash dividends paid.

As a result, cash and cash equivalents as of June 30, 2015, totaled ¥28,690 million, up ¥6,699 million from March 31, 2015.

3. Qualitative information regarding consolidated business results forecasts

SCREEN Holdings has revised its consolidated business forecast for the fiscal year ending March 31, 2016, from the previously announced forecast on May 13, 2015 as listed below. This is attributable mainly to the prospect that sales and profit for the second half of the fiscal year are likely to exceed our assumption reflecting a current order situation in the Finetech Solutions Segment.
