BUSINESS RESULTS

1. Business Results

Overview

During the fiscal year ended March 31, 2016, global economic conditions continued to gradually improve, mainly reflecting strong consumer spending in the United States. Economies in Europe saw ongoing recovery, due in part to the effects of ongoing monetary easing. On the other hand, the global economic outlook became more uncertain, with China's economy slowing further amid a worsening real estate market and chaotic financial market as well as concerns of prolonged economic stagnation in emerging economies due to low natural resource prices and other factors. The Japanese economy, meanwhile, saw improvement, backed by improving corporate earnings and gradual recovery in consumer spending, despite concerns in the latter half of the year regarding the effects of adopting negative interest rates, a strengthening yen and weaker stock prices.

With regard to the business conditions surrounding the SCREEN Group, in the semiconductor industry, capital investment among memory manufacturers was firm, backed by increasing demand for high-capacity data servers. In addition, reflecting expanding demand for IoT-related electronic devices for automobiles and other, the market for equipment for sub-200 mm wafers showed signs of growth in demand. With regard to graphic arts equipment, demand in the Japanese market continued to recover. In the FPD business field, investment in large-sized LCD panels for televisions increased in China, as did investment in small- and medium-sized LCD panels in Taiwan and Japan.

Under these circumstances, the SCREEN Group posted consolidated net sales of ¥259,675 million for the fiscal year ended March 31, 2016, an increase of \(\frac{4}{22}\),029 million from the previous fiscal year. On the earnings front, operating income totaled \(\frac{4}{23}\),557 million, up ¥6,389 million year on year, reflecting the increase in net sales and improvement in the variable cost ratio, despite the increase in fixed costs, including rises in R&D expenses and personnel costs. Ordinary income amounted to ¥23,178 million, up ¥7,082 million year on year. Under extraordinary income, the Company recorded gain on sales of investment securities, reflecting the sale of held stocks. As a result, income before income taxes totaled \(\xi23,942\) million, and profit attributable to owners of parent totaled \(\xi18,815\) million, up ¥6,693 million compared with the previous fiscal year.

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Financial Results by Business Segments

Performance by reportable segment is explained below.

The Semiconductor Solutions (SE) Segment

In the SE segment, sales to logic chip manufacturers and foundries decreased year on year, but those to memory and image sensor manufacturers went up. By product, overall sales of cleaning equipment were up year on year, reflecting strong sales of batch-type cleaning equipment. Sales of coater/developers for sub-200mm wafers also increased. By region, sales to the United States and Europe fell, but sales in Taiwan and Japan rose. As a result, net sales in this segment amounted to \\pm\$165,801 million, up 5.3% year on year. Operating income in this segment came to \\\pm\$18,715 million, up 18.9% from the previous fiscal year, reflecting an improvement in the variable cost ratio and the increase in net sales, despite an increase in fixed costs, including R&D expenses and personnel costs.

The Graphic and Precision Solutions (GP) Segment

In the GP segment, due to increased sales in Japan with efforts to further penetrate the print on demand (POD) equipment market as well as the depreciation of the yen, sales of graphic arts equipment increased year on year. Sales of printed circuit board (PCB)-related equipment were roughly flat year on year, as sales of mainstay direct imaging systems grew in China although those fell in Japan. As a result, net sales in this segment came to \(\frac{\pmathbf{4}}{6}1,279\) million, up 10.0% year on year. This segment posted operating income of \(\frac{\pmathbf{4}}{3},169\) million, an increase of 11.6% from the previous fiscal year, reflecting the increase in net sales, despite a rise in the variable cost ratio due to changes in the product mix and an increase in fixed costs, including R&D expenses and personnel costs.

The Finetech Solutions (FT) Segment

In the FT segment, sales of production equipment for small- and medium-sized LCD panels in Taiwan and Japan increased significantly year on year. As a result, net sales in this segment amounted to \(\frac{\pmathbf{3}}{3}\)1,589 million, up \(\frac{\pmathbf{7}}{7}\)815 million, or 32.9%, year on year. Reflecting the increase in net sales, this segment posted operating income of \(\frac{\pmathbf{2}}{2}\)748 million, a significant increase from operating income of \(\frac{\pmathbf{2}}{3}\)39 million in the previous fiscal year.

Outlook

Overall economic conditions in the coming year are expected to continue to gradually improve. While wariness due to economic deceleration in China and resource-exporting countries is growing, particularly with regard to its effects on the global economy and financial markets, ongoing monetary easing in developed countries is expected to help ensure stability.

In the SE segment, capital investment by semiconductor manufacturers is expected to be steady, reflecting growing demand for AI-related devices, sensors, data servers and other products related to the Internet of Things (IoT) and big data. In the GP segment, the SCREEN Group will work to further strengthen its sales framework through such measures as promoting strategic tie-ups with partner companies in order to expand its POD equipment market share. In the FT segment, in addition to ongoing capital investment in production equipment for televisions in China, investment in small- and medium-sized LCD panels in Taiwan and Japan is expected to increase. In Other, the Group will strive to expand sales in new business fields.

In terms of earnings, the Group will work to bolster profitability by reducing variable costs and controlling fixed costs, aiming to achieve an operating income to net sales ratio of 10% or above, a major target of the three-year medium-term management plan, Challnege2016.

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2. Financial Position SCREEN Holdings Co., Ltd.

Status of assets, liabilities, and net assets

Total assets as of March 31, 2016 stood at \(\frac{4}{270}\),093 million, an increase of \(\frac{4}{20}\),577 million, or 8.2%, compared with March 31, 2015. This was largely due to increases in notes and accounts receivable-trade and cash and time deposits, despite a decrease in investment securities.

Total liabilities amounted to \$149,805 million, up \$11,801 million, or 8.6%, compared with the end of the previous fiscal year. This was mainly attributable to increases in notes and accounts payable-trade and advances received. Interest-bearing debt decreased by \$40 million, or 0.1%, from March 31, 2015 to \$39,636 million. Net interest-bearing debt, or interest-bearing debt minus cash and time deposits, decreased by \$6,772 million compared with the previous fiscal year-end to \$7,264 million.

Total net assets amounted to \(\frac{\pmath{\text{\$}}}{120,288}\) million, up \(\frac{\pmath{\text{\$}}}{8,775}\) million, or 7.9%, from March 31, 2015. This was mainly attributable to the increase in retained earnings as a result of the recording of profit attributable to owners of parent, despite decreases in valuation difference on available-for-sale securities and foreign currency translation adjustment due to decreases in the market values of held stocks and the appreciation of the yen.

As a result, the equity ratio as of March 31, 2016 stood at 44.3%.

Status of Cash Flows

The status of cash flows during the fiscal year ended March 31, 2016 is as follows.

Net cash provided by operating activities amounted to ¥14,720 million, compared with ¥1,492 million used in operating activities in the previous fiscal year. This was because the increase in income before income taxes, increases in notes and accounts payable—trade, advances received and other inflows surpassed such cash outflows as increases in notes and accounts receivable—trade and inventories.

Net cash used in investing activities amounted to \(\frac{\text{\frac{4}}}{2,557}\) million, compared with \(\frac{\text{\frac{4}}}{6,317}\) million used in investing activities in the previous fiscal year. This was attributable to the purchase of property, plant and equipment, such as equipment for R&D, which was partially offset by the sale of investment securities.

Net cash used in financing activities amounted to \$2,845 million, compared with \$3,822 million used in financing activities in the previous fiscal year. This was largely attributable to the payment of cash dividends and acquisition of treasury stock.

As a result, cash and cash equivalents as of March 31, 2016 totaled \(\frac{1}{2}\)30,156 million, up \(\frac{1}{2}\)8,166 million from March 31, 2015.

3. Basic Policy Regarding Appropriation of Profits, Cash Dividends for the Fiscal Year under Review and Cash Dividend Forecast for the Fiscal Year Ending March 31, 2017

The SCREEN Group works to secure the retained earnings necessary for the sound maintenance of a financial base able to respond to future changes in the business environment. Considering this aim together with such factors as progress made toward the targets set under its three-year medium-term management plan Challenge2016 of an operating income to net sales of 10% or above and an equity ratio of 50% or above as well as yearly in profit, the SCREEN Group aims for a total consolidated shareholder return ratio of 25%.

SCREEN Holdings (SCREEN HD) expects to distribute a fiscal year-end cash dividend of ¥12 per share for the fiscal year ended March 31, 2016.

SCREEN HD currently anticipates a fiscal year-end cash dividend forecast of ¥70 per share for the fiscal year ending March 31, 2017.

Note that SCREEN HD is planning to implement a one-for-five consolidation of shares on its common stock effective October 1 2016, contingent on approval at the Company's 75th ordinary general meeting of shareholders to be held on June 28, 2016. The forecast per-share year-end dividend calculated using the number of shares before the consolidation of shares is ¥14.

BUSINESS POLICY

1. Basic Business Policy

The SCREEN Group strives to increase corporate value and aims to gain prominence in new business fields while maintaining its edge in existing business domains under a corporate philosophy comprising "Sharing the Future" (earning the trust and meeting the expectations of society, while keeping an eye on the future), "Human Resource Development" (developing human resource through better work), and "The Pursuit of Technology" (pursuing original technology and mixing it with existing technology), and in line with the Management Grand Design, which sets out a vision of the SCREEN Group and a long-term management plan to realize such vision. In addition, the Group adheres to a CSR Charter that contains a Code of Conduct for all officers and employees, seeking to fulfill its corporate social responsibility and contribute to the sustainable development of society.

2. Medium- to Long-Term Business Strategies and Issues

The SCREEN Group is implementing its three-year medium-term management plan, Challenge 2016 (fiscal 2015–fiscal 2017).

In the fiscal year ending March 31, 2017, the final year of the plan, the SCREEN Group will continue working to further reduce variable costs and control fixed costs while aiming to complete earnings structure reforms and achieve operating income to net sales of 10% or above, a key target of the plan. To strengthen its financial standing, the Group will raise its asset efficiency and continue to boost the equity ratio. Furthermore, the Group will work to accelerate the establishment of businesses in new fields for future growth. To this end, the SCREEN Group will work to further bolster sales of the new products introduced in each new business area to firmly establish their market positions while aggressively pursuing coordinated activities with other companies under its open innovation strategy.

Through the initiatives of the three-year medium-term management plan, the SCREEN Group aims to steadily raise ROE and maximize free cash flow while returning profits to shareholders, targeting a total consolidated shareholder return ratio of 25% in line with its shareholder returns policy, and striving to increase corporate value.

The SCREEN Group will formulate the next three-year medium-term management plan in light of progress made under the current plan. Details will be announced as they are decided.

BASIC PREMISE ON ACCOUNTING STANDARDS

In consideration of possibilities that these consolidated financial statements may be subject to trend analysis and/or comparison with other companies' financial statements, the SCREEN Group's policy is to produce its consolidated financial statements according to Japanese accounting standards.

[Segment Information]

1. Segment Overview

(1) Calculation Method for Reportable Segments

The SCREEN Group's reportable segments are the business units for which the Company is able to obtain respective financial information separately in order for the Board of Directors to conduct periodic investigations to determine distribution of management resources and evaluate their business results.

Although the SCREEN Group had adapted an internal company system by product or service it handles, an internal company was split up in connection with change to holding company structure.

Each subsidiary that assumed its business continuously develops business activities and establishes its own comprehensive strategy, for both Japan and overseas markets, in accordance with the products it handles.

Consequently, the SCREEN Group has created three business segments for reporting— "Semiconductor Solutions (SE)," "Graphic and Precision Solutions (GP)" and "Finetech Solutions (FT)"—categorized by products based on above subsidiaries.

(2) Products and Services of Reportable Segments

The SE segment develops and manufactures semiconductor production equipment and conducts sales and maintenance services. In the GP segment, graphic arts equipment and PCB related equipment are developed, manufactured, sold and maintained. The FT segment develops, manufactures, and markets FPD production equipment and others, and it also conducts maintenance services.

2. Measurement of Net Sales, Income (loss), Assets and Other in Reportable Segment

Income for each reportable segment is the amounts based on operating income. Intersegment revenues and transfers are based on market prices.
