1. Overview of Operating Results and Others

The Company and its consolidated subsidiaries have applied the "Partial Amendments to Accounting Standard for Tax Effect Accounting" (ASBJ Statement No. 28, February 16, 2018) and relevant Guidances effective from the beginning of the fiscal year ended March 31, 2019, and have performed a year-on-year comparison of its financial position by retrospectively adjusting the figures at the end of the previous fiscal year.

(1) Overview of the consolidated operating results for the current fiscal year

During the fiscal year ended March 31, 2019, although the Japanese economy continued to recover at a gradual pace, on the back of results from various economic measures and improvements in the employment and income environments, despite weakness in some parts of exports and production, the economy continued to be exposed to downside risks from the impacts of the trends in trade problems on the global economy, the uncertainties in overseas economies and fluctuations in the financial and capital markets.

Under these circumstances, the Toyo Suisan Group (hereafter, the "Group"), has remained committed to its mission "to contribute to society through foods" and "to provide safe and secure foods and services to customers" under the corporate slogan of "Smiles for All." The Group continued to implement further cost reductions and promoted aggressive sales activities in its efforts to face an increasingly competitive sales environment.

As a result, net sales were \(\frac{\pma}{401,064}\) million (up 3.2% year on year), operating profit was \(\frac{\pma}{23,661}\) million (down 11.2% year on year), ordinary profit was \(\frac{\pma}{26,169}\) million (down 8.4% year on year), and profit attributable to owners of parent was \(\frac{\pma}{18,438}\) million (up 0.0% year on year) for the current fiscal year.

The foreign exchange rate for the fiscal year was \\pm 111.00 to the U.S. dollar (\\pm 106.25 to the U.S. dollar for the previous fiscal year).

The operating results by segment are as follows.

[Seafood Segment]

In the Seafood Segment, although the Group focused on selling products at reasonable prices amid continued price rises in the price of fish for the core products of salmon, trout etc. as well as price rises in the cost of fish due to diminishing shore fish catches in Japan and other countries, competition intensified and sales volumes decreased. As a result, segment sales were \(\frac{429}{998}\) million (down 6.3% year on year), while segment profit was \(\frac{4158}{158}\) million (down 45.2% year on year).

[Overseas Instant Noodles Segment]

In the Overseas Instant Noodles Segment, sales increased in the U.S. owing to not only favorable sales of the bag-type noodle product *Ramen* series, and the cup-type noodle product *Instant Lunch* series, our signature products, which were boosted by a strengthening of in-store display promotions such as "back-to-school" sales and mass-display campaigns and the boosting of marketing activities using SNS and so forth, but also stronger sales of our *Yakisoba* series, for which we introduced new flavors, and our *Bowl* series, which began to be adopted by a greater number of mass retailers. In Mexico, sales increased thanks to favorable sales of cup-type noodles, our signature products, amid stable exchange rates for local currencies. As a result, segment sales were \footnote{83,786} million (up 14.7% year on year). Segment profit was \footnote{9,582} million (down 3.9% year on year) due to the increases in raw materials costs, personnel expenses, distribution costs, despite factors contributing to higher profit such as increased sales volume and reduced sales promotion costs.

[Domestic Instant Noodles Segment]

In the Domestic Instant Noodles Segment, sales were on roughly even with those of the previous year for cuptype noodles as a result of promotions to expand sales of the Japanese-style series such as *Akai Kitsune Udon*, whose 40th anniversary since its launch was central to these promotions, and *Midori no Tanuki Ten Soba*, as well as the *MARUCHAN QTTA* series and *Gotsu Mori* series, to both of whose lineups we added new items. In bagtype noodles, despite efforts such as stimulating new demand by launching new flavors in the *Maruchan Seimen* series, total sales decreased. As a result, segment sales were \mathbb{127,570} million (down 1.1% year on year). Segment profit was \mathbb{17,860} million (down 5.4% year on year), mainly due to the increases in distribution costs and raw materials costs.

[Frozen and Refrigerated Foods Segment]

In the Frozen and Refrigerated Foods Segment, sales increased thanks to not only robust sales in fresh noodles for our signature product *Maruchan Yakisoba* (*Three-Meal Package*) series, but also significant growth in sales for new product *Pari-Pari Mugen* series, which offers a very tasty way to eat vegetables, new product *Tsuruyaka* series, whose preparation simply requires separating the noodles by water, and *Koku no Itteki* series, which was launched last year. Among frozen and chilled foods, sales were strong for collaboration products, new products such as those offered for a limited time only, and the household *Frozen Yakisoba Noodles*. As a result, segment sales were \mathbb{4}69,189 million (up 0.8% year on year). Segment profit was \mathbb{4}4,543 million (down 13.8% year on year) due to an increase in raw materials costs and other expenses.

[Processed Foods Segment]

In the Processed Foods Segment, the packaged cooked rice and freeze-dried products markets continued to expand through increased opportunities for consumption accompanying changes in lifestyles. Amid this background, our new factories began operations, leading to increases in production capacity. This allowed us to execute aggressive sales promotion activities, including the launch of new products, the renewal of existing products, and consumer campaigns, leading to increased sales. As a result, segment sales were \(\frac{4}{22}\),667 million (up 6.3% year on year). The segment reported a segment loss of \(\frac{4}{977}\) million (compared with a segment profit of \(\frac{4}{133}\) million in the previous fiscal year) owning to the increases mainly in depreciation associated with the start of operations of the new factories.

[Cold-Storage Segment]

In the Cold-Storage Segment, operations proceeded satisfactorily at the Heiwajima Cold-Storage Facility, which opened in March 2018. In addition, our aggressive sales activities resulted in robust sales to both new and existing customers from trade centered on frozen food and trade in incidental businesses such as customs clearance and transportation. As a result, segment sales were \frac{\pmathbf{1}}{18,463} million (up 4.6% year on year). Segment profit was \frac{\pmathbf{1}}{1,609} million (down 20.9% year on year) due to the increase in depreciation associated with the Saitama Sugito Distribution Center and the Kobe Distribution Center, which were put into operation in January.

[Other Business Segment]

The Other Business Segment consists of mainly the packed lunch/deli food business. Segment sales were ¥49,388 million (up 4.8% year on year), while segment profit was ¥1,484 million (up 26.5% year on year).

(2) Overview of the financial position for the current fiscal year

The total assets of the Group increased by ¥18,347 million (4.9%) compared with the end of the previous fiscal year, to ¥390,190 million. The positions of assets, liabilities, net assets at the end of the current fiscal year are as follows.

[Current assets]

Current assets increased by \(\frac{\pmathbb{2}}{2,534}\) million (1.3%) compared with the end of the previous fiscal year, to \(\frac{\pmathbb{2}}{203,298}\) million. The main contributing factors were increases in cash and deposits, merchandise and finished goods, and raw materials and supplies, despite a decrease in securities.

[Non-current assets]

Non-current assets increased by \(\pm\)15,813 million (9.2%) compared with the end of the previous fiscal year, to \(\pm\)186,891 million. The main contributing factors were increases in buildings and structures and machinery, equipment and vehicles, despite a decrease in construction in progress.

[Current liabilities]

Current liabilities increased by ¥795 million (1.5%) compared with the end of the previous fiscal year, to ¥53,870 million. The main contributing factor was an increase in other current liabilities.

[Non-current liabilities]

Non-current liabilities increased by \$705 million (2.5%) compared with the end of the previous fiscal year, to \$28,590 million. The main contributing factor was an increase in deferred tax liabilities.

[Net assets]

Net assets increased by ¥16,847 million (5.8%) compared with the end of the previous fiscal year, to ¥307,729 million. The main contributing factors were increases in retained earnings and foreign currency translation adjustment.

(3) Overview of cash flows for the current fiscal year

Cash and cash equivalents (hereafter, referred to as "cash") as of the end of the current fiscal year decreased by \(\frac{4}{2}\),123 million from the end of the previous fiscal year to \(\frac{4}{2}\)3,286 million. The respective cash flow positions are as follows.

[Cash flows from operating activities]

Net cash provided by operating activities increased by ¥1,657 million compared with the previous fiscal year to ¥31,028 million. The main contributing factors were decreases in profit before income taxes and income taxes paid.

[Cash flows from investing activities]

Net cash used in investing activities increased by ¥6,973 million compared with the previous fiscal year to ¥27,358 million. The main contributing factor was an increase in purchase of property, plant and equipment.

[Cash flows from financing activities]

Net cash used in financing activities decreased by ¥318 million compared with the previous fiscal year to ¥6,163 million. The main contributing factors were an increase in increase in short-term loans payable and a decrease in decrease in short-term loans payable.

(4) Future outlook

Regarding the prospects for the next fiscal year (fiscal year ending March 31, 2020), the Group anticipates further gradual recovery, as it expects to benefit from various economic measures while continuing to enjoy improvements in the employment and income environments, despite seeing weakness in some parts of exports and production. However, it is necessary to be mindful of the impacts that the trends in trade problems will have on the global economy, the uncertainties in overseas economies and the effects of fluctuations in the financial and capital markets.

In the food industry, although signs of pick-ups in personal consumption are visible, while consumer consciousness in terms of protecting livelihood and preferences for low-priced products continue, and market situations are still tough. Moreover, the demand for social responsibility on the part of companies, such as food safety and assurance, is ever increasing. The Group is further implementing vigorous sales activities that strengthen sales promotions by region and product. In addition, even on the cost side, in order to address more severe competition in sales, the Group will concentrate on thorough cost reductions by restructuring the distribution system and in the manufacturing division.

From the above, therefore, it is expected that the net sales for the full fiscal year will be \(\frac{\pmathbf{4}}{20,000}\) million (up 4.7% year on year), the operating profit will be \(\frac{\pmathbf{2}}{27,000}\) million (up 14.1% year on year), the ordinary profit will be \(\frac{\pmathbf{2}}{29,500}\) million (up 12.7% year on year), and the profit attributable to owners of parent will be \(\frac{\pmathbf{2}}{21,000}\) million (up 13.9% year on year). The Japanese yen to U.S. dollar currency exchange rate is forecasted to be \(\frac{\pmathbf{1}}{11.00}\).

2. Basic Rationale for Selection of Accounting Standard

The Group currently prepares the consolidated financial statements according to the generally accepted accounting standards in Japan (Japanese GAAP), as it makes it possible to compare the consolidated financial statements against previous fiscal year and against other companies.

The Group is considering applying IFRS in the future in light of the trends of other companies in Japan applying IFRS.

Segment information

1. Summary of reportable segments

Reportable segments are classified as those that are part of the Company for which separate financial data can be obtained and which are subject to regular examination so that the Board of Directors can determine how to allocate business resources and evaluate earnings.

The Group has established business departments based on the type of products and services, with each business department creating a comprehensive strategy and engaging in business activities relating to the products and services it handles. The Overseas Instant Noodles Segment is a management unit established independently by overseas subsidiaries. The business unit creates a comprehensive strategy and engages in business activities relating to the products it handles.

The Group thus consists of segments characterized by product and region based on business departments and overseas subsidiaries. The Group has 6 reportable segments, namely, the Seafood Segment, Overseas Instant Noodles Segment, Domestic Instant Noodles Segment, Frozen and Refrigerated Foods Segment, Processed Foods Segment and Cold-Storage Segment.

The Seafood Segment procures, processes and sells seafood. The Overseas Instant Noodles Segment manufactures and sells instant noodles overseas. The Domestic Instant Noodles Segment manufactures and sells instant noodles in Japan. The Frozen and Refrigerated Foods Segment manufactures and sells frozen and chilled foods. The Processed Foods Segment manufactures and sells processed foods (excluding instant noodles, frozen and chilled foods). The Cold-Storage Segment freezes and stores food in cold warehouses.

2. Information relating to calculation of net sales, profit, assets and other items by each reportable segment

The accounting method used for reported business segments complies with accounting policy that has been adopted in preparing the consolidated financial statements.

Profit of reportable segments is calculated based on operating profit.

Intersegment sales or transfer is calculated based on current market price.
